

Asnuntuck Community College Associate's Degree to Springfield College Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice

After earning your Associate's degree, you will be responsible for completing a maximum of 39 credits of criminal justice major requirements, any additional elective credits to reach 120, and fulfilling the College's residency requirement of 45 credits, including 15 of your last 30. Springfield College waives all general education requirements, with the exception of those that are major requirements, due to earning an associate's degree and accepts a maximum of 75 transfer credits.
